



























11 Beneficial Use Impairments (BUIs) were originally identified to be associated with the Detroit River:

- 1. Restrictions on fish and wildlife consumption
- 2. Tainting of fish and wildlife flavor
- 3. Degradation of fish and wildlife populations
- 4. Fish tumors or other deformities
- 5. Bird and animal deformities or reproductive problems
- 6. Degradation of benthos
- 7. Restrictions on dredging activities
- 8. Restrictions on drinking water consumption or taste and odor problems
- 9. Beach closings
- 10. Degradation of aesthetic
- 11. Loss of fish and wildlife habitat

The two BUIs highlighted in red have been removed.



CSOs and contaminated sediments impede removal of many BUIs


Friends of the Detroit River is focusing on the two BUIs highlighted in red – fish and wildlife-related BUIs.
